SCHOLARSHIPS

Cox Scholar Programs - For students attending Indiana University.

Go to onestart.iu.edu and the application is live now through the OneStart Accounts, under their "Financial" section. Look for "Bloomington Scholarship Application".

Each of the Cox Scholar Programs has a different work component, and is designed to help hard-working students with financial need by providing a scholarship of **at least 75% of the official cost of attendance at IU.**

The deadline for all application materials is **March 10th.**

Parochial Promise – Thomas More College.

A special scholarship for graduates of a parochial high school, called the Parochial Promise. Recently, this amount was increased to \$11,000 per year for students who are unconditionally admitted to the college. The student receives this award all four years. This is a significant discount for students to attend Thomas More. We don't charge in-state vs. out-of-state tuition, but Indiana residents also qualify for the \$2,000 "out of state award," which will bring their *minimum* scholarship package to more than half tuition!

New American College Scholarship.

The New American Scholarship is open to individuals who:

A.) have arrived in the United States within the last four years and are high-school seniors planning to attend an accredited university or college in Indiana as a full-or part-time student; or

B.) individuals who have arrived in the United States within the last four years and are enrolled in and completing at least six credit hours per semester or quarter at an accredited Indiana college or university.

The Bright Futures Scholar Program

Recognizes high school seniors based on their leadership skills, academic achievements and community service activities. Recipients will receive a laptop, carrying case and associated software.
