THE AWARD

A \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded in \$500 allotments each fall semester for a maximum

of four years of eligibility. The award will be applied by the USI Financial Assistance Office toward the recipient's tuition, fees, and books while attending the University of Southern Indiana and maintaining a cumulative 3.25 or better grade point average.

THE CRITERIA

- The recipient must be a current-year graduating senior from a high school in one of these counties: Marion, Johnson, Morgan, Hendricks, Boone, Hamilton, Hancock, Rush or Shelby.
- The recipient must have a cumulative 3.25 or better grade point average to be eligible.
- The recipient must register at USI as a full-time student (minimum of 12 hours per semester).
- The recipient must maintain a cumulative 3.0 or better grade point average while attending USI.

CHECKLIST

Applicants must return all materials (postmarked) by **March 9** to USI Alumni and Volunteer Services, 8600 University Boulevard, Evansville, Indiana, 47712.

Enclose the following materials:

- An official high school transcript
- The completed application
- The 200-word essay in response to one of the following questions; Why are you interested in pursuing higher education? or What course of study do you plan to pursue and why?

Thomas More College

Thomas More College announced the creation of an innovative new program called **TMC3, The Three Year Degree Program at Thomas More College**. The College is excited to offer students the option of earning a Bachelor's Degree in three years as part of the compressed degree program. Students will take classes during the fall, spring and summer semesters of their first and second year and the fall and spring, of their third year, for a total of eight semesters. Students will generally take 18 hours in the fall and spring, primarily in major courses and 12 hours in the summer, primarily in the core curriculum.

In order to be eligible for the TMC3 program, a student must: earn a 3.0 high school GPA; obtain a 26 composite on the ACT (or SAT equivalent); be admitted to Thomas More by submitting the general admission application, transcript and test scores; and complete the TMC3 application. The priority deadline for the program application is March 1 and final deadline is May 1. More information about the program is available at www.thomasmore.edu/tmc3.

Ivy Tech

The HONORS Program offers additional benefits to students who seek out the challenge. Ivy Tech's HONORS Program is the most affordable honors program in the state. There is no additional cost to apply and Ivy Tech's tuition is nearly half the tuition of other state

HONORS courses will be clearly marked on the student's transcript, adding distinction to university and employment applications and students who successfully complete the HONORS degree program will graduate with honors. HONORS students will receive priority registration, meaning they will be able to register for courses sooner than other students. HONORS students will also have special advisors assigned to them to assist with course scheduling and registration.
