2. National Council of Jewish Women

Below please find a brief overview of the 2018 scholarships offered by the National Council of Jewish Women, Indianapolis Section. Please contact Ms. Triplet if you are interested in any of these scholarships.

- Francis E. Mazur Scholarships are awarded to high-school seniors planning to attend an accredited Indiana college or university as a full-time student. Men and women of any religious affiliation may apply.
- New American Scholarships are awarded to:
 - i. A.) high school seniors who have arrived in the United States within the last four years and plan to attend an accredited Indiana college or university on a part- or full-time basis. Men and women of any religious affiliation may apply.
 - ii. B.) adults who have arrived in the United States within the last four years and are currently attending an accredited Indiana college or university as a part- or full-time student. Men and women of any religious affiliation may apply.
- Judith B. Lichtenberg Single Parent Scholarships are awarded to adults who care for dependents and are returning to school for post-high school certificates, associate or bachelor degrees in order to better support themselves and their families. Men and women of any religious affiliation may apply.
- Jewish Student Scholarships are awarded to high-school seniors who are Jewish and plan to attend an accredited college or university as a full-time student.
- Mary Fink Merit Scholarship is awarded to one high-school senior who is Jewish and plans to attend an accredited college or university as a full-time student.--WE
